### US Bishops call for prayers after Capitol is stormed in protest

"I join people of good will in condemning the violence today at the United States Capitol," said the President of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) in a **statement**, following violence that engulfed the US Capitol on Wednesday in which four people died.

"This is not who we are as Americans. I am praying for members of Congress and Capitol staff and for the police and all those working to restore order and public safety," he continued.

from gunshot wounds and three from medical emergencies - and 52 people were arrested.

Archbishop Gomez went on to note that the peaceful transition of power is one of the hallmarks of this great nation. "In this troubling moment, we must recommit ourselves to the values and principles of our democracy and come together as one nation under God."

**Cardinal Blase Cupich** of Chicago also called on Catholics and on all men and women of goodwill to pray for peace "at this bracing moment in US history, a history

that has been marked by one of democracy's greatest virtues: the peaceful and orderly transition of power."

In a series of tweets, Cardinal Cupich said, "What has been unfolding at the Capitol today should shock the conscience of any patriotic American and any faithful Catholic."

"The eyes of the world look on in horror as we suffer this national



**Archbishop José Gomez'** statement came after the chaos that ensued after hundreds of President Donald Trump's supporters stormed the U.S. Capitol building on Wednesday in a bid to overturn his election defeat. Protesters battled police in the hallways and delayed the certification of Democratic President-elect Joe Biden's victory for hours.

Police said four people died during the chaos - one

disgrace," he tweeted.

He noted that for many months Americans have witnessed "the deliberate erosion of the norms of our system of government" and described peaceful protest as a sacred right, an essential component of social progress over the course of human history.

Cardinal Cupich continued: "Violence is its opposite. Violence in the service of falsehood is worse."

The fruit of this decade is **Desire for Holiness.**

Matt 17: 1: Jesus took Peter, James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain by themselves and was transfigured before them.

**Reflection** Jesus with tender love prepares Peter, James and John for His bitter Passion and Death. He takes these three beloved followers to Mount Tabor and is transfigured before their eyes. They see the glory of God's Son Je-

sus. They hear the voice of the heavenly Father tell them to listen to Jesus, Who is His beloved Son. Each of us also has our sorrowful mysteries during our lives. It is inescapable. So, Jesus wants also to strengthen us along our journey of life. He gives us many sources of strength and help.

He loves us so much that He chose to remain with us in the Holy Eucharist. In contrast with the transfiguration, now His glory is hidden under the simple appearances of bread and wine. He does this so we are better able to approach Him and remain with Him. Jesus waits us day and night in His home which is the tabernacles of our Churches. # Jesus leads a new 'exodus', opening up the promised land of Heaven

Readings:

Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7  
Psalm 29:1-4, 9-10  
Acts 10:34-38  
Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

The Liturgy last week revealed the mystery of God's plan—that in Jesus all peoples, symbolized by the magi, have been made "co-heirs" to the blessings promised to Israel. This week, we're shown how we claim our inheritance.

Jesus doesn't submit to John's baptism as a sinner in need of purification. He humbles Himself to pass through Jordan's waters in order to lead a new "exodus"—opening up the promised land of heaven so that all peoples can hear the words pronounced over Jesus today, words once reserved only for Israel and its king: that each of us is a beloved son or daughter of God (see Genesis 22:2; Exodus 4:22; Psalm 2:7).

Jesus is the chosen servant Isaiah prophesies in today's First Reading, anointed with the Spirit to make things

right and just on earth. God puts His Spirit upon Jesus to make Him "a covenant of the people," the liberator of the captives, the light to the nations. Jesus, today's Second Reading tells us, is the One long expected in Israel, "anointed . . . with the Holy Spirit and power."

The word Messiah means "one anointed" with God's Spirit. King David was "the anointed of the God of Jacob" (see 2 Samuel 23:1-17; Psalm 18:51; 132:10, 17). The prophets taught Israel to await a royal offshoot of David, upon whom the Spirit would rest (see Isaiah 11:1-2; Daniel 9:25).

That's why people of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to John. But it isn't John they're looking for. God confirms with His own voice what the Angel earlier told Mary—Jesus is the Son of the Most High, come



to claim the throne of David forever (see Luke 1:32-33).

In the Baptism that He brings, the voice of God will hover over the waters as fiery flame, as we sing in today's Psalm. He has sanctified the waters, made them a passage—a way to healing and freedom—a fountain of new birth and everlasting life.

## Jesús lidera un nuevo 'éxodo', abriendo la tierra prometida del Cielo

La liturgia de la semana pasada reveló el misterio del plan de Dios: que en Jesús todos los pueblos, simbolizados por los magos, han sido hechos "coherederos" de las bendiciones prometidas a Israel. Esta semana, se nos muestra cómo reclamamos nuestra herencia.


Jesús no se somete al bautismo de Juan como pecador que necesita purificación. Se humilla a sí mismo para pasar por las aguas del Jordán para dirigir un nuevo "éxodo", abriendo la tierra prometida del cielo para que todos los pueblos puedan escuchar las palabras pronunciadas sobre Jesús hoy, palabras que una vez fueron reservadas sólo para Israel y su rey: que cada uno de nosotros es un amado hijo o hija de Dios (véase Génesis 22:2; Exodus 4:22; Salmo 2:7).

Jesús es el siervo escogido Isaías

profetiza en la Primera Lectura de hoy, ungido con el Espíritu para hacer las cosas bien y justo en la tierra. Dios pone Su Espíritu sobre Jesús para hacer de él "un convenio de el pueblo", el libertador de los cautivos, la luz para las naciones. Jesús, la segunda lectura de hoy nos dice, es el que se esperaba desde hace mucho tiempo en Israel, "ungido... con el Espíritu Santo y el poder."

La palabra Mesías significa "ungido" con el Espíritu de Dios. El rey David fue "el ungido del Dios de Jacob" (véanse 2 Samuel 23:1-17; Salmos 18:51; 132:10, 17). Los profetas enseñaron a Israel a esperar una rama real de David, sobre quien descansaría el Espíritu (véanse Isaías 11:1-2; Daniel 9:25).

Por eso la gente de todo el campo



de Judea y todos los habitantes de Jerusalén iban a Juan. Pero no es John lo que están buscando. Dios confirma con Su propia voz lo que el ángel le dijo anteriormente a María — Jesús es el Hijo del Altísimo, ven a reclamar el trono de David para siempre (véase Lucas 1:32-33).

En el Bautismo que trae, la voz de Dios flotará sobre las aguas como llama ardiente, mientras cantamos en el Salmo de hoy. Ha santificado las aguas, las ha convertido en un pasaje—un camino hacia la sanación y la libertad—una fuente de nuevo nacimiento y vida eterna.
